

The Big Idea:

1. Children will understand that Jesus did many miracles.
2. Children will learn that Jesus loves people very much.
3. Children will concentrate on the area of Bible as they learn:
 - a. The Bible is God's Word.
 - b. The Bible tells what Jesus did.
 - c. I can learn about God and Jesus from the Bible.



Weekly Objective: The children will know that God has authority over everything. Jesus did miracles because He is God and He cares about people.

During the Week at Home!

Take your child’s favourite children’s Bible with pictures. See the four Bible stories above and have your child tell you the stories by using the pictures. Ask your child questions by pointing to the picture. *Questions like:* What is this person doing? What is Jesus doing? What happened after Jesus healed the lepers/fed the people/walked on the water/healed the blind man? How did Jesus heal the lepers/feed the people/walk on water/heal the blind man? Have your child tell you the story.

Have your child grab his favourite toy people (e.g., lego, playmobil). Have one of you be Jesus and the other person is a person in the story. Act out the story together.

Thank God together and tell Him how awesome He is. Have fun!
