



Grade School February – Abraham

The Big Idea:

Kids will learn that when God asks us to do something, He will also give us everything we need to do it.
Kids will learn what it means to have faith.
Kids will understand that God is always there for us and He keeps his promises.

Bible skills:

Kids will understand where the story of Abram/Abraham fit on the Bible timeline.
Kids will be able to understand why the story of Abram/Abraham is important for Jesus' birth.
Kids will be able to name the books of the Bible that contain the story of Abram/Abraham.

Scripture: "So don't worry about these things, saying, 'What will we eat? What will we drink? What will we wear?' These things dominate the thoughts of unbelievers, but your heavenly Father already knows all your needs.
